re Read 1 Thessalonians 4 verses 1 and 2

- these verses could be called 'bridge / transition' verses. Why?
- does it mean just to 'brothers'? Were there no 'sisters' in the church in Thessalonica? see Acts 17:4 and 1 Thes.1:1
- would you agree with commentators who suggest that it is a generic word meaning both genders?

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- the instruction here is, end of v.1, 'Now we ask you and urge you in the Lord Jesus to do this more and more'
- Which words show that the writers really want them to do this?
- what is it they plead with them to do more & more?
 - 1. to pray
- 2. to please God
- 3. to know

TO PLEASE GOD

- this was the challenge, and it is still the challenge today; it is ultimately to please God, to keep pleasing Him and to do this more and more

 - a. to teach a subject?
 - **b.** to tell others what and/or how to do things?
 - c. to inform someone of facts?
 - **d.** to authorise somebody to act?
