'I charge you before the Lord to have this letter read to all the brothers'

Summary

- <u>Chapter 1</u> (see also Acts 17) = writers and Thessalonians first contact
- <u>chapter 2</u> = the way the writers worked among them and their sudden separation
- <u>chapter 3</u> = reasons for Timothy's visit and his good report
 <u>Question</u>: how do you think the Thessalonians would have felt after reading this? (Yes, well pleased!!!)
- <u>final chapters, 4 & 5</u>: **35 instructions** (with few comments) coming not from frustration but satisfaction inviting further progress

re Read 1 Thessalonians 4 verses 1 and 2

- these verses could be called 'bridge / transition verses'
- does it mean just to 'brothers' ? commentators suggest it is a generic word meaning both genders; see Acts 17:4 & 1 Thes.1:1
- the instruction here is, end of v.1, 'Now we ask you and urge you in the Lord Jesus to do this more and more'
- quite an emphatic plea!!
- what is it they plead with them to do more & more? 'to please God'

TO PLEASE GOD

- this was the challenge, and it is still the challenge today; it is ultimately to please God, and keep pleasing Him
- help from what being said in these verses:
- . '<u>we instructed you'</u>: instructions needed, need to be told what & how to do it, it does not necessarily come automatically

. <u>'as in fact you are living'</u>:

* instructions need to be lived out.

- *confirms sense of satisfaction, not just with men but God *although not always the case; see also 1 Cor.3:1, Heb.5:11-14
- . '<u>to do this (pleasing God) more and more</u>': satisfaction yes but no complacency, it is a journey not a destination
- . '<u>you know'</u>: some instructions they already knew, it was only a reminder; we might have to be reminded too (see 1 Pet.1:12-16)
- . '<u>by the authority of the Lord Jesus'</u>: some are commissioned by Jesus to instruct others and be an example (1 Pet.5/2-4), it is their 'ministry/service'

to sum up:

Actions to take

- to show humility concerning being instructed
- to put in practice instructions
- be aware of being pleasing to God
- willing & praying to please Him more and more
- being open to God wanting us to instruct others
