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SESSION 1 - 'put together on faith'

(1) Read Luke 17 verses 5 to 10

- (2) to start (note; questions in bold and [suggested answers in italics] - what is Luke 17:1-4 about?
- [the seriousness of provoking others to sin, especially children and the importance of on going forgiveness]
- are they linked to our passage (v.5-10)? [some commentators suggest that the request of more faith on the part of the apostles is linked to these previous verses; needing increased faith to fulfil these 2 difficult things other commentators propose that these verses are not linked but are about a new thing Luke wants his readers to know regarding Jesus' teaching]
- has Jesus used a similar comparison for faith elsewhere?

[Matthew and Mark tell us that Jesus used a similar comparison for faith in 2 other separate contexts; see Mt.17:14-21 and Mk.11:20-26]

 whatever the reason for the disciples to make their request Jesus again takes the opportunity to repeat his teaching about the same aspect of <u>faith</u> [= not easy for disciples to grasp and important to Jesus]

3 <u>FAITH</u>

- in Lk.17:5-10 what are the 2 different aspects of faith Luke actually conveys?

1. <u>verse 5</u>?

[faith in God, Luke gives us an object lesson in faith = faith in practice

- what do we learn re faith in Hebrews 11:1-6?

[faith is about <u>belief</u> in God (v.6a) and also having <u>confidence</u>, <u>assurance</u> in Him (v.1) and <u>expectation</u> from Him (v.6b)]

- it took faith from the disciples to make their request known to Jesus (Lk.17:5)
- does verse 6 seem to be a rebuke?

[he knew their reason for asking and not the only time he would have rebuked them; 'you of little faith', expression favourite of Matthew's: 6:23-33 (worry), 8:23-27 (fear), 16:5-12 (insecurity), 17:14-21 (failure)]

- what do you make of the following comment; 'common experiences but not commendable; still forgivable' ? [Jesus still calmed the storm]
- are some are commended for their "great faith"? see Mt.8:5-13 & 15:21-28
- <u>how is **Heb.11:6-19**</u> a summary of Abraham's journey of faith, the possibility & importance of trusting, having & growing in confidence in God?

(<u>faith</u> continued)

[starting from believing in God's existence (v.6) and going on to God's different characteristics; His wisdom (v.8), His reward (v.9), His power & faithfulness (v.11), His greatness (v.12), His knowledge (v.17-18), His victory (v.19)]

- faith is not static, but a journey in learning to know God & his attributes, to know Him – the better we know the better the faith / trust
- 2. what is the 2nd aspect of faith in Lke 17:6-10? [faith from God]
- Jesus' reply has 2 sections; v.6 = teaching and v.7-10 = illustration
 what is the teaching of v.6?

[faith as mustard seed; faith can be a journey, as seen above, but in v.6 Jesus says that faith can also be compared to just a small mustard seed - no mention of growing into a big tree as in Lk.13:18-19 & suggested by some commentators

- so not a journey but for a single event, for the removal of 'this' mulberry tree (no doubt Jesus pointing at it) [or a 'mountain' or anything else that requires removing or needs to happen]

- so what is this faith about? see Lk.17:6 with Mt.17:20; Mk.11:23)

<u>'if you have faith</u>'? [**conditional**, a question of having it (even small), not having a little and getting more, not automatic]

<u>how to know if</u>? See Mk 11:23 ? ['does not doubt in their heart but believe what they say will happen' = **assurance**]

'he did what he was told to do', Lk.17:9? [God's way of saying what he wants 'you can say'? [importance of being specific, commanding things to happen 'it will obey' or 'it will be done for them' (Mt.17:23) = certain promise (see end of v.21, Mt.17) with time lapse (unqualified) and God's doing not just us faith listed in the gifts of the Holy Spirit; 1 Cor.12:7-11 (v.9), 1 Cor.13:2

- what is the point of v.7 to 10 in Luke 17? [the illustration is to ensure the whole important humility + continuous service from those so gifted with such faith]

(4) to sum up: <u>counting on the help of the Holy Spirit to ...</u>

- realise the importance of having faith in God believing and growing in our confidence in Him
- be honest and admit any failure in fully trusting Him
- understand the different aspect & potential of faith as a mustard seed
- cooperate with the Holy Spirit in speaking out whenever gifted with such faith
