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### **SESSION 1** - guided by joy

1 Read Matthew 5 verses 10 to 12 with Luke 6:17-23

2 to start: (please note: questions in bold & underlined

suggested answers in italics and [])

- what is Matthew 5 verses 10 to 12 about?

[part of a description of people displaying 8 different characteristics <u>declared</u> '<u>blessed'</u> (the beatitudes, M.5:3-12) which are the start of a longer message Jesus gave early on in his ministry, the 'Sermon On the Mount' (Mt.5-7)]

- the first (v.3) and the last beatitudes (v.10) make reference to the <u>Kingdom of</u>
   <u>God</u> so it can be concluded that the people displaying the 8 unusual features
   already belong to this kingdom (not trying to get in by these 'good works')
- how can the word 'blessed' be better translated?
   ['enviably fortunate' (Amplified Version) rather than just 'happy'.
   Each beatitude mentions the reason for being declared 'blessed', even when not considered in a very 'happy and enviable' situation / attitude at the time!
- what else can each reason be taken as?
   [God's promise] of a future & direct permanent result in His eternal Kingdom, over compensating and rewarding any loss]
- what is especially encouraging about the last beatitude (v.10)?
  [it concern the 'astonishing' characteristic of 'being persecuted'
  v.11 reports what Jesus meant by 'persecution' [see also Lk.6:22]
  please note the grounds for the persecution = 'because of righteousness' v.11
  and 'because of me' v.12 (see also 1 Pet.3:13-17, 4:14-16)]
- to make sure the disciples do not miss the point, Matthew reports Jesus making it <u>personal</u> and <u>warning</u> his disciples [v.11 = 'blessed are you ...']
- what is also surprising to say the least in verse 12?

it is also the only one where Jesus demands a reaction:

- = 'Rejoice and be glad' ('leap for joy' Lk.6:23)
- if <u>iov</u> is expected by Jesus following such adverse circumstances, would he not anticipate it at all other times?

#### <u>3</u> <u>JOY</u>

- the news of Jesus described as 'the good news of great joy' (Luke 2:10)
- confirmed in the Gospels, in Acts, in history and maybe in your experience (remember your conversion?)

- (joy continued)
- is it meant to last? Is the Christians life meant to be a joyful one? What would you say looking at some Christians?
- what do the Scriptures say?
  - \* do you think heaven as a joyful place? [read Luke 15; note vv.7, 10, 31]
  - \* do you think of Jesus as 'joyful'? see John 15:11; [what do you think the disciples' reaction was, 'yes please' or 'no thanks'?]
  - \* what is the Holy Spirit's influence in our lives? see Gal.5:22. Rom.14:17. 1 Thes.1:6
  - \* the apostle's wishes for the Roman Christians; Rom.15:13
  - \* idea of 'rejoicing' <u>14 times in 4 chapters</u> of Philippians:

1:4, 18 (x2), 25; 2:2, 17, 18, 28, 29: 3:1; 4:1, 4(x2), 10

- \* as seen in Mat.5:12 not just when all has gone well: see also James 1:2-4, 1 Pet.4:12-13
- what is then the conclusion from the Scriptures?

[yes, there will be moments of suffering & sadness! But generally God wants Christians to be joyful people]

- how is possible to be joyful people?

[not just relying on people & circumstances but learning to focus elsewhere

- \* see Phil.4:4 [= 'in the Lord' (thinking about God helps us to rejoice)]
- \* see Rom.12:12 [= <u>'in hope'</u> (remember Matt.5:12 = 'reward', thinking about what is waiting for us like other 'beatitudes')]
- \* see Luke 10:20 [= thinking about what God has & is doing for us that has eternal dimension]
- 4 to sum up: counting on the help of the Holy Spirit to ...
- not just wait for people & circumstances to turn good in order to rejoice
- force ourselves to think about

God Himself, what He has done for us, what He is doing, what He will do,

- learn to rejoice whatever we have been through
