SESSION 1 - in all liberty

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Read Galatians 5 verses 1 to 12

to start (note; questions in bold and [suggested answers in italics]

- what is the only instruction of this passage?

[end of verse 1 = 'therefore remain firm and not let yourselves ...the yoke of bondage]

- what is its context?

[see beginning of the v.1 = Paul uses the word freedom]

- to know why Paul speaks of freedom see the first 4 chapters
- Summary of the first 4 chapters of the letter to the Galatians: [if time permits read the 4 chapters]
- * Chap. 1 and chap.2:1 14 = <u>Paul defends his Ministry</u>
 (after introduction and astonishment, importance and origin of his message, approval of the other Apostles, firmness against Pierre)
- * Chap. 2:15-21, Chap. 3 and 4 = <u>Paul defends his doctrine</u> (summary of the 'justification by faith', call to the experience of the Galatians, the example of Abraham his faith and the promise, place of the Law, appeal to the friendship of the Galatians, attention given to the 2 sons of Abraham)
- who says 'defence' says 'problem' and calls for a solution

- what is the solution proposed by Paul?

[see Gal.5:1; Paul begins chap.5 by saying that one of the goals of the salvation of Jesus is not bondage but <u>freedom</u> and to be firm on this]

- so to finish the letter, Paul so wants to instruct Christians to live in all freedom, starting with our passage = Gal.5:1-12

FREEDOM

- what is the aspect of the Law that Paul underlines in these verses?
 [see verses 2, 3, 6 and 11 = 'circumcision' = 'surgery on the foreskin of the male organ']
- where does this rite come from and why?

[Gen.17:1-14 = sign of the alliance between God and Abraham and his descendants and repeated in the Law - Lev.12:3]

- is that Paul is against circumcision itself?

[see Act.16:1-3 (all the more astonishing it is just after Act.15:1-29) and 1 Cor.9:19-23]

- what is the real problem?

[see Gal.1:6-10, 2:16, 3:1-5, 4:8-11 and Act.15:1 and 5 - obedience to the law added to faith in Jesus for salvation]

- what are the consequences to add circumcision to faith in Christ given by Paul in our passage?

[see Gal.5:2, 5:3 (= 'servitude' of the v.1), 5:4, 5:6, 5:7, 5:8]

- are there similar "additions" today?

[maybe not circumcision but something else like ' one or more of the 10 commandments, belonging to a denomination, water baptism, baptism in the Holy Spirit... etc...]

- can we conclude that the consequences are the same? [of course!]
- is the solution also the same? /

Yes, one of the goals of the salvation of Jesus is still, not bondage but <u>freedom</u> and we must stand firm on it]

to sum up: Actions to take

- Remember that the only Gospel is to believe in Jesus Christ, in order to be justified by faith in Christ
- not to want or let anything be added to this Gospel, not even the works of the Law
- not be diverted from this truth by anyone or anything, even an Angel
- always keep firmly in mind that one of the goals of salvation by Jesus Christ is freedom and therefore not let ourselves be enslaved by anything.

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
